

EMPLOYMENT PATHWAYS

The State Hospital has a variety of full-time and part-time posts available whether you are looking to change your career or start afresh. We welcome people from all walks of life. The NHSScotland Careers website at <https://www.careers.nhs.scot/> will help you explore your options.

The State Hospital is a high secure hospital and the current organisational position based on a risk assessment is that we welcome applications from people under the age of 18 for non-clinical roles. To work in a clinical role, applicants should be 18 years and older.

Apprenticeships

Modern Apprenticeship

These are primarily aimed at people who are 16 to 24, although there is no upper age limit. A Modern Apprentice is employed and works towards a qualification with a college or learning provider. This is a great way to start your career where you can get a job, get paid, and gain valuable qualifications all at the same time.

Entry requirements vary from National 4, National 5, or Higher depending on the role. It can take one to four years to complete depending on the level of apprenticeship. You will not be paid less than the Scottish Living Wage, but may get paid more than this. For further information visit <https://scottishlivingwage.org/>.

Service leavers and veterans

Armed forces qualifications

When you are applying for a role, we may ask for specific qualifications or equivalent experience. This may cause you to be unsure about how your qualifications and experience will be recognised in the NHS.

The Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF) can help you understand your qualifications. You can find out more about the framework and the level of your qualifications at <https://scqf.org.uk/support/support-for-individuals/support-for-veterans/>.

When searching for vacancies on our recruitment website, you will see that each Job Description includes a minimum criteria. Knowing the SCQF level of your qualifications will help when you apply. Your qualifications and experience could also be suited to jobs you have not thought of before. The skills you have gained are transferable and can be used in lots of different jobs; you develop them throughout your life, in education, in work, and in your social life.
