1. Where (if anywhere) has RAAC been identified in the Board?
2. Has any assessment been made of RAAC structural strength? Please share these with us.
3. Have any risks assessments been completed in line with Regulation 3 of The Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999? See the regulations [here](#).

4. Who is the key officer or expert in the Board with whom we can further liaise directly about safety of the estate?
5. What mitigations have been made and proposed? Please share with us a timescale of completed and planned works.
6. What are the plans for evacuation? What would the trigger point for evacuation be? How would doctors will be affected under these plans?
7. Are there, or may there be, circumstances of danger which may be reasonably believed to be serious and imminent?
